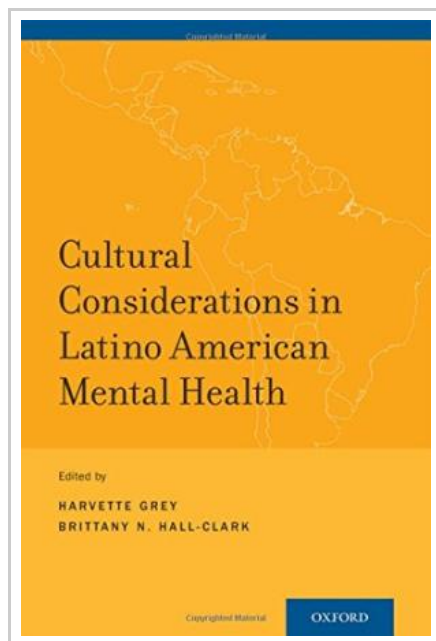




Cultural Considerations in Latino American Mental Health (Paperback)
