States Colored Troops The 29th Connecticut Colored Regiment was gotten up by Colonel Pardee, and encampted at Crape Vine Point, New Haven, Connecticut. The recruiting was commenced in August, 1863. The inducements held out to men to join this Regiment were these: they were to receive a bounty of \$310 from the State, \$75 from the County from which they enlisted, and \$300 from the United States. The \$310 from the State we received, the other bounties we did not receive. There were several men who took an active part in recruiting for this Regiment, among them Lieutenant Brown of New York, to whom great credit is due. There were others, both colored and white, who did very much towards filling up the Regiment. Sergeant Archie Howard, Orderly of Company C, recruited more men than any other excepting Lieut. Brown, but I am sorry to say, that after all he did the parties failed to pay him according to promise, and he was ordered to his Regiment...
