While this book is a fictionalized account based in part on the author's true experiences on the border--his father was mysteriously killed in 1962 while trying to help the "braceros"--the backdrop is based on facts and actual happenings, allegedly after organized crime discovered the massive profits to be made exploiting the Mexican farm workers. A fast-paced, thrilling story of intrigue, murder, racial prejudice and the clash of two cultures on the California border, of wide interest today! Includes histories of U.S.-Mexican race relations (then and now), border problems, the huge illegal immigration...
